The Annual Staff wishes to give you, in this edition of the Red Raider, an accurate account of the life and activities of Corning High School during the 1949-1950 school year.

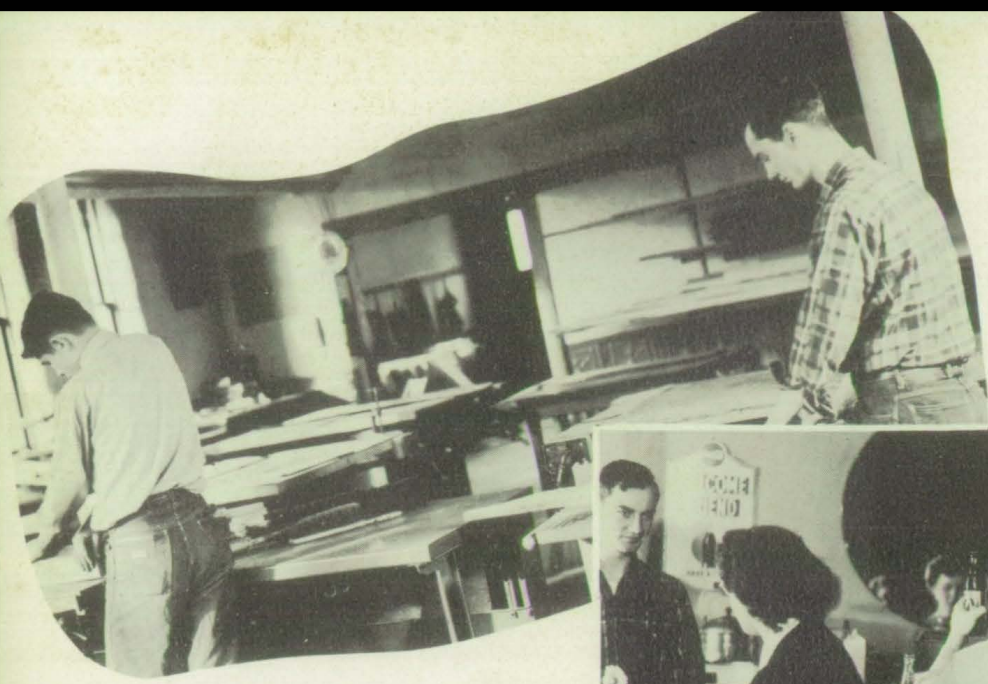

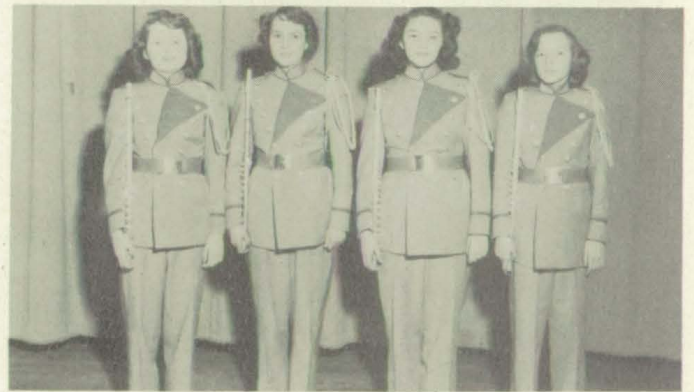

The Korning Kapers

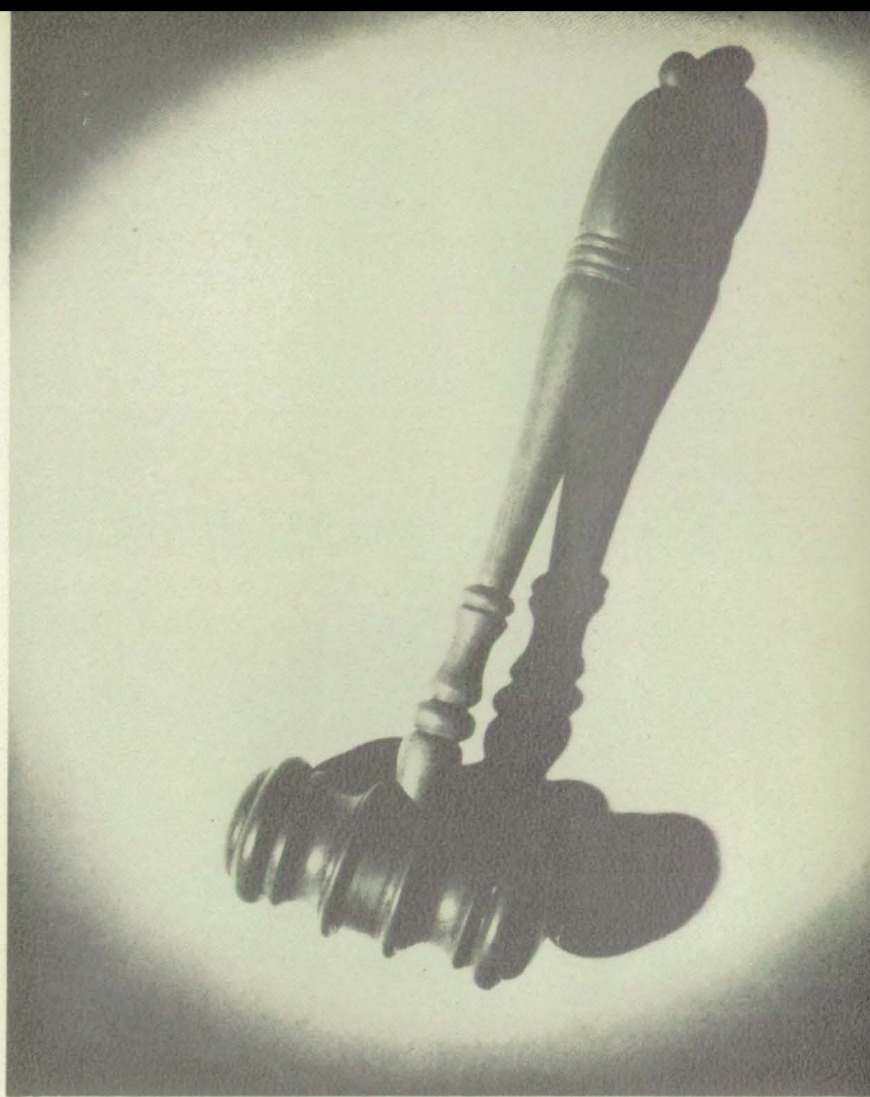

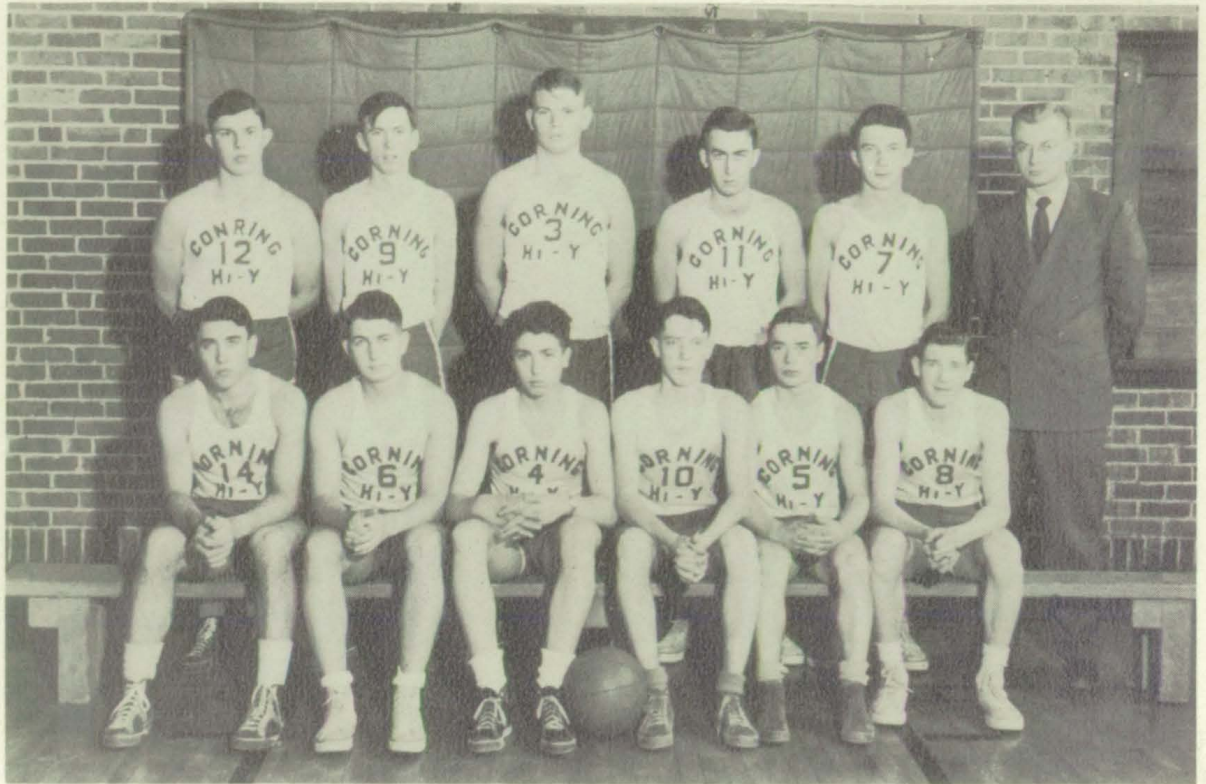
Hi-Y

During college he was inducted into the Marine Corps and then returned to be graduated from Iowa University in 1947.

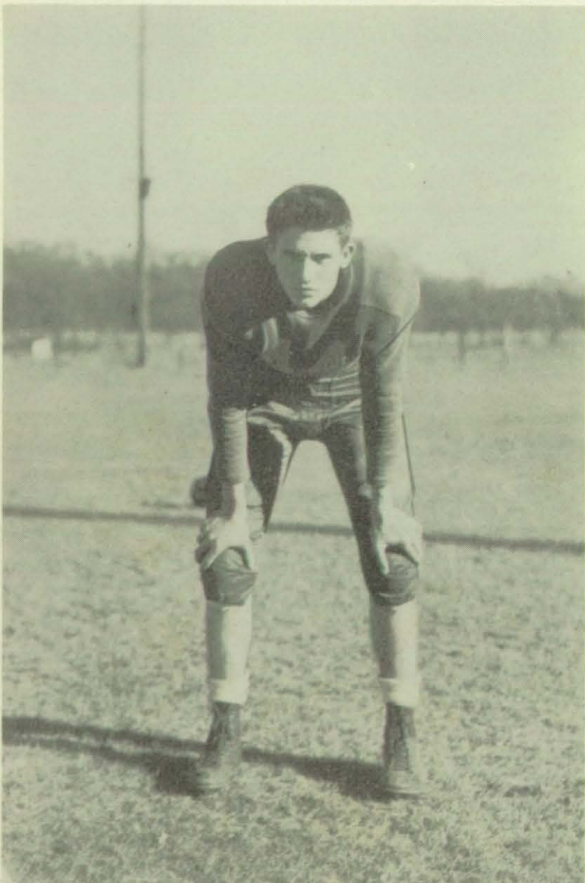
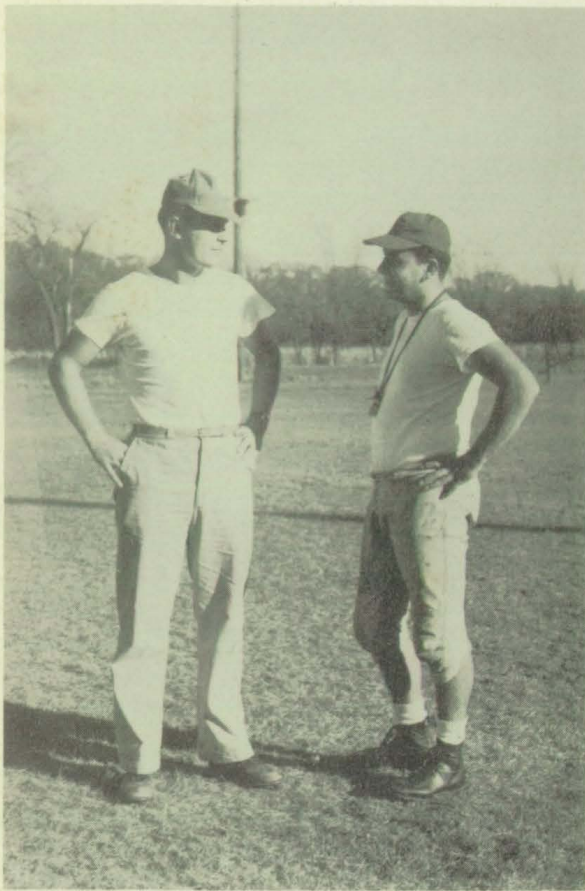

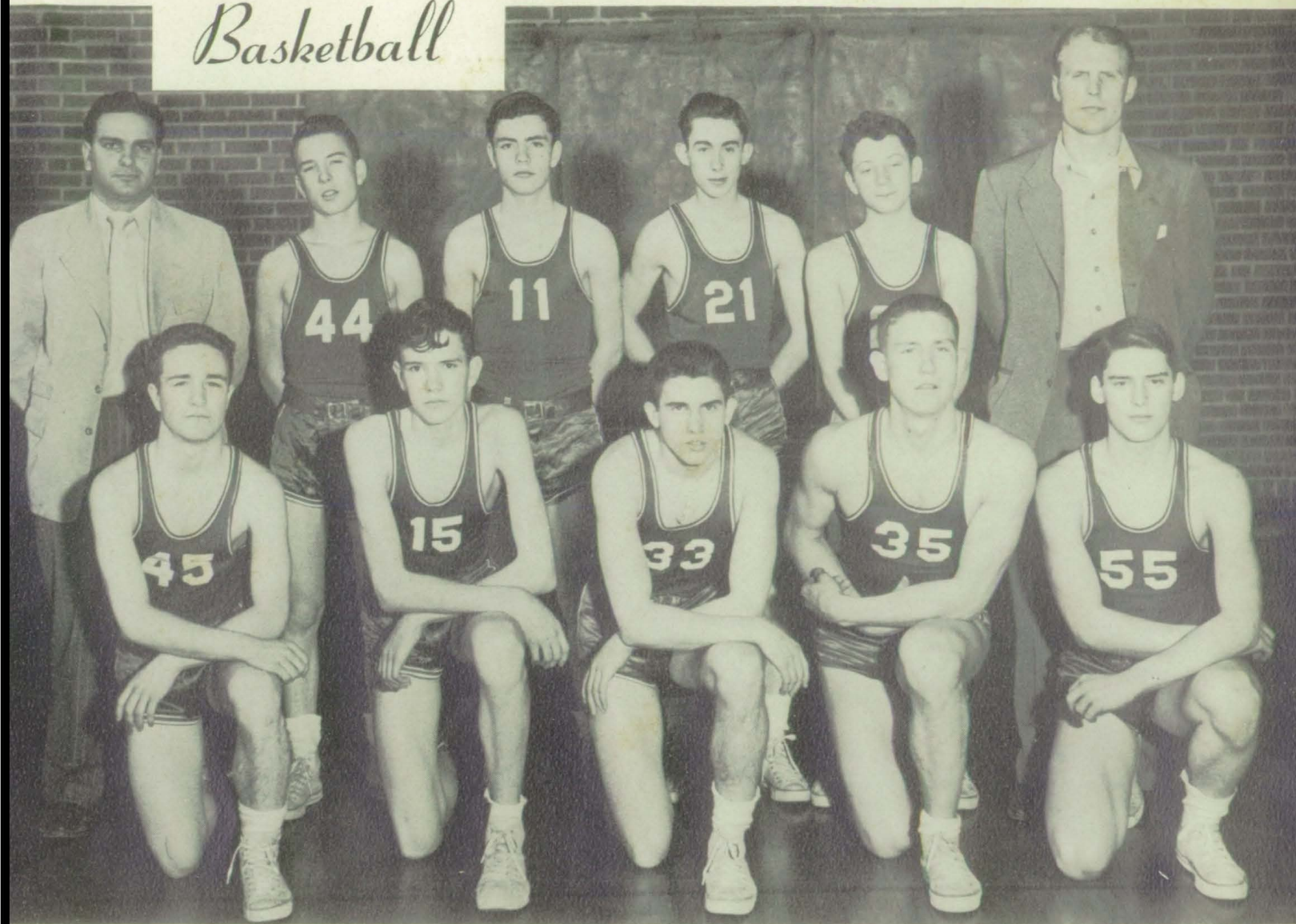
Ed Mullin, a senior, was chosen as the 1949-50 captain of both the football and basketball teams.
