




As in the body of an airplane, CHS is divided into compartments. The freshman, sophomore, junior and senior passenger travels his four-year route in class rooms.







Much high school energy is burned on the runways of the CHS Sports Department. We build strong and healthy bodies that can land and take off with true sportsmanship.




True beauty serves mankind. CHS beauties add luxury to our flight.


The 7 win 2 loss record the Raiders compiled is the best showing made by a CHS team since 1943.
