

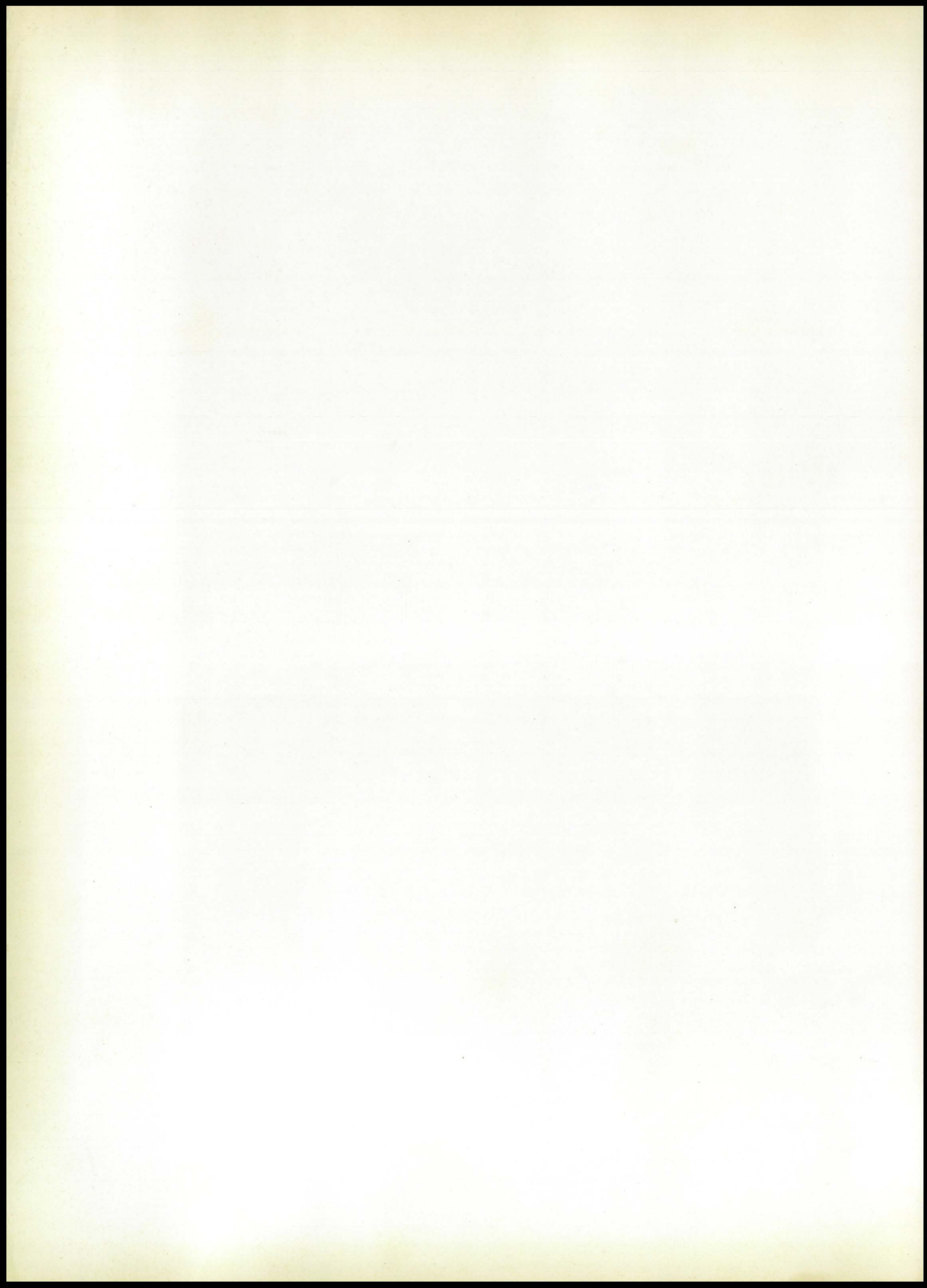

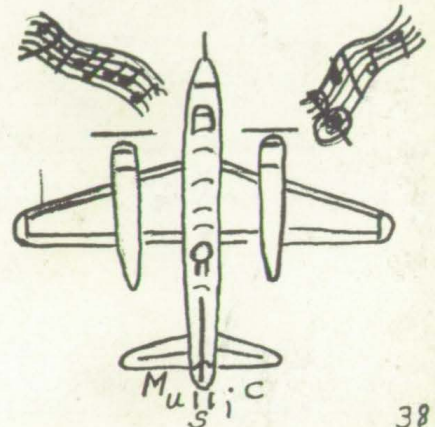

As in the body of an airplane, CHS is divided into compartments. The freshman, sophomore, junior and senior passenger travels his four-year route in class rooms.



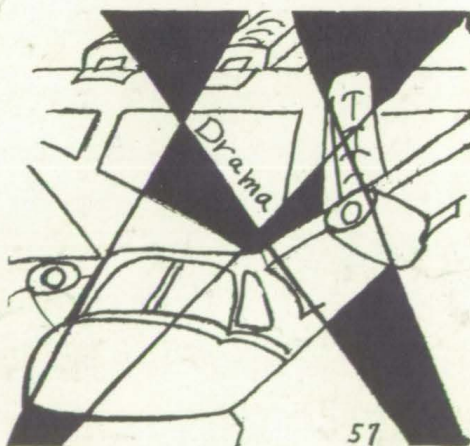

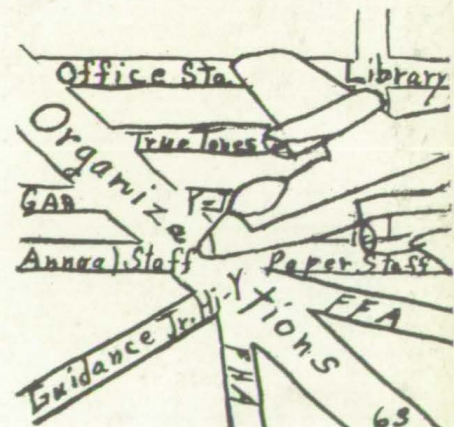
Above the roar of our progressive engines the music makers of CHS fill the air with melody.

The 7 win 2 loss record the Raiders compiled is the best showing made by a CHS team since 1943.

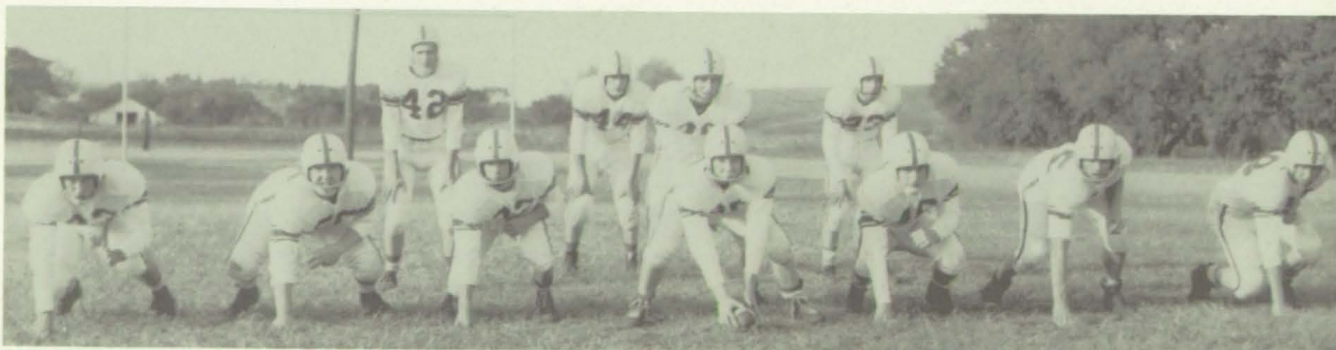
The record earned a tie for first place in the Hawkeye Eight conference with Red Oak and Shenandoah, which is the highest Corning has ever finished in the conference.
