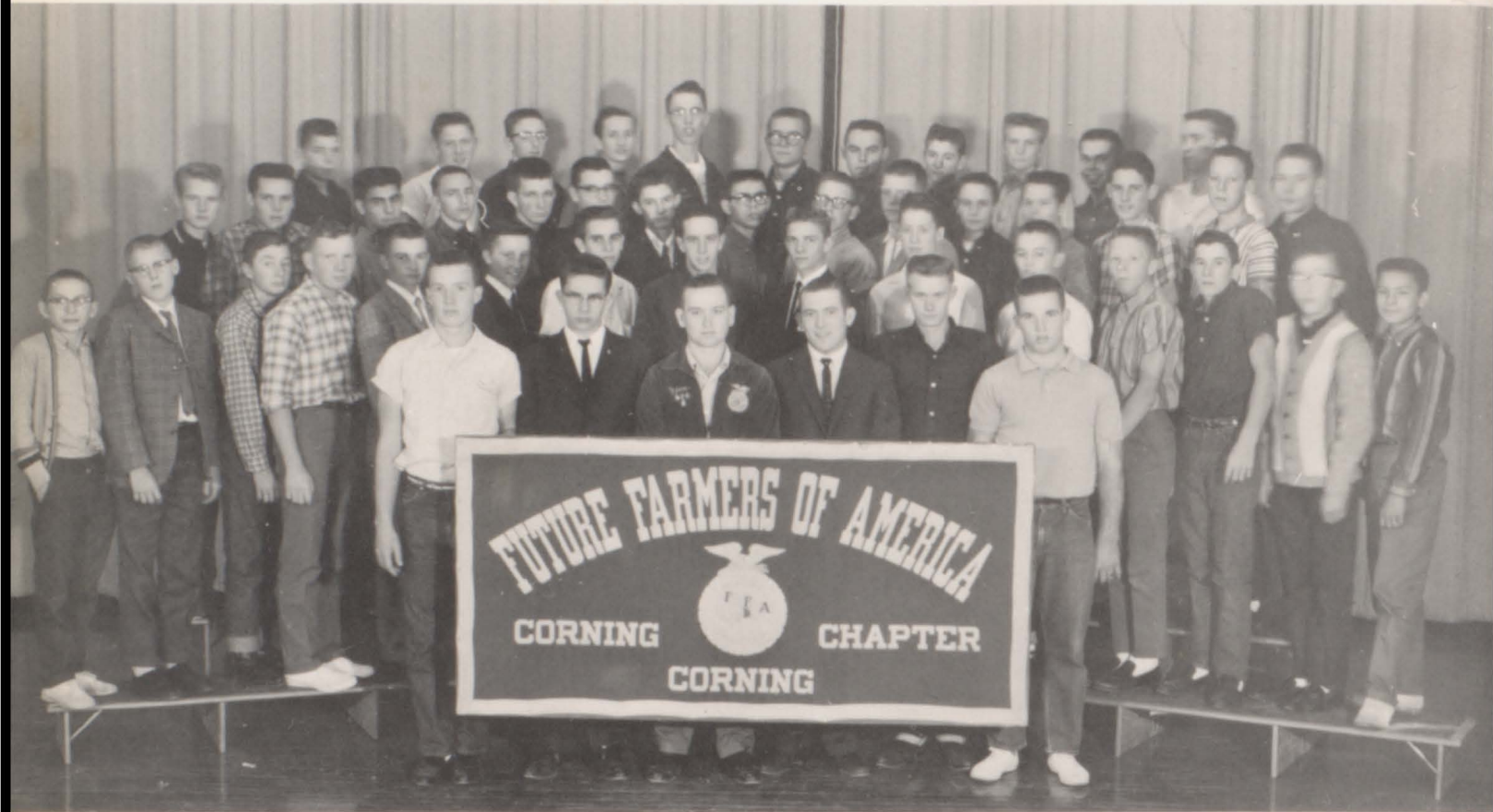

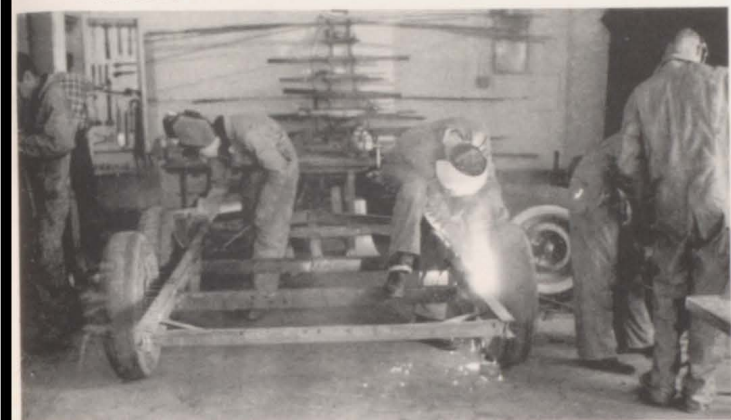

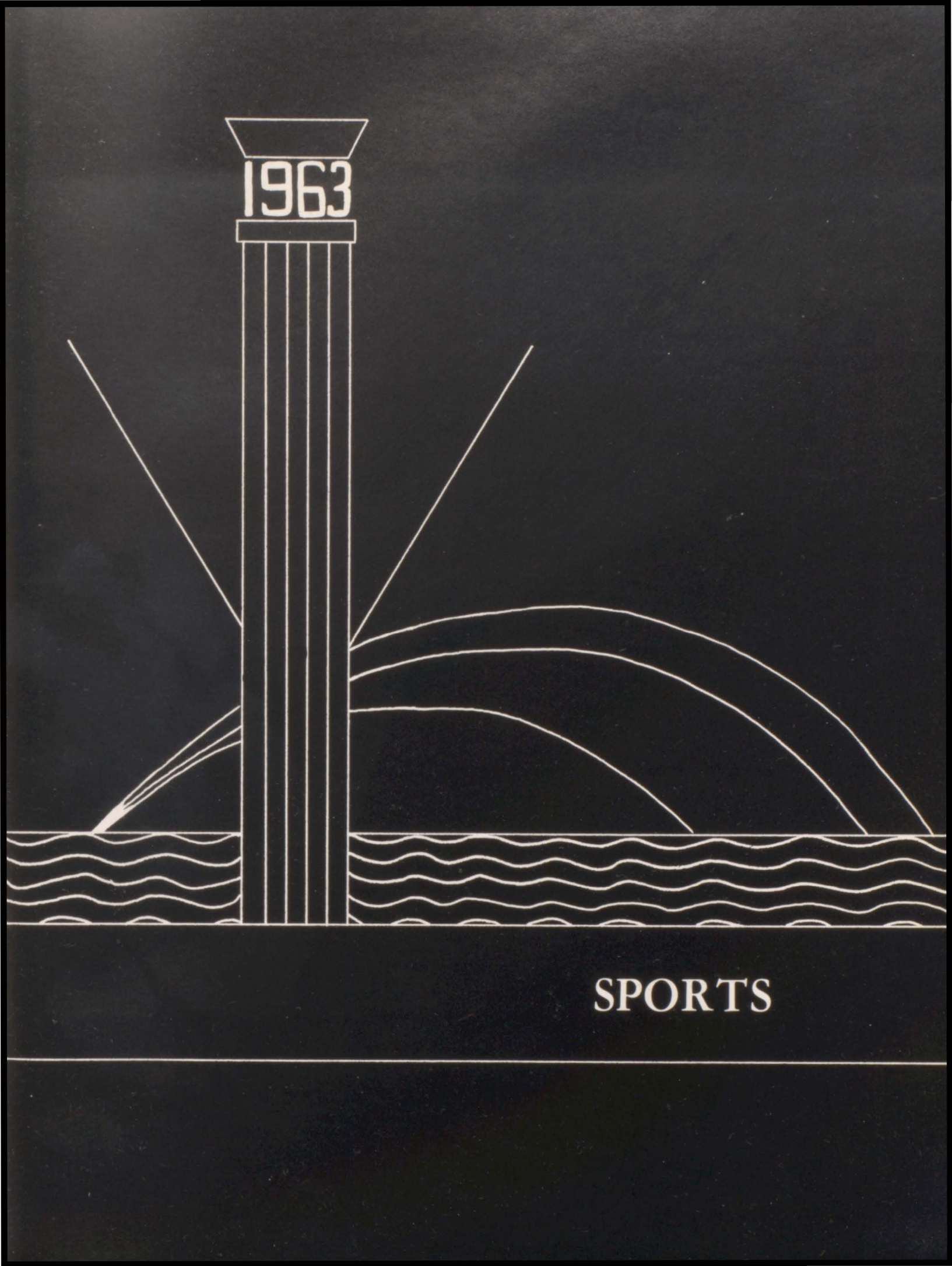
In January, nineteen students were selected to attend the Creston Vocal Festival for two days. The 258 voice chorus climaxed the Festival with a concert for the public.
