




Under the correct guidance of the board, great strides forward have been made. These include:


- 1. Increased plant facilities.

- 5. Teaching aids and equipment.






















HISTORY OF THE "CHUTING STARS"

The U.S. Navy Parachute Exhibition Team, the "Chuting Stars" were formed in 1961 at the Naval Parachute Facility, El Centro, California, to help commemorate the 50th anniversary of Naval Aviation. Originally formed as a temporary unit, the public response during the team's exhibitions throughout the country was so successful that the "Chuting Stars" became a permanent organization. They were then placed under the operational control of the Chief of Naval Air Training, VADM Fitshugh Lee, and assigned to their present home base at the Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Florida.

The "Chuting Stars" are comprised of sixteen expert jumpers whose mission is to travel the length and breadth of this country demonstrating free-fall techniques to stimulate interest in the Navy in general, and in Naval aviation in particular. The members of the team are not professional sky-divers, but are Naval Parachutists - volunteers whose past work has pioneered in the research and development of pilot safety and survival equipment. Projects such as ejections from jet aircraft and the design of equipment for the Astronauts are a part of their contribution to increased safety in aviation.

The free-fall maneuvers executed by the "Chuting Stars" thrill both young and old alike. While free-falling from 12,500 feet to their parachute opening altitude of 2,500 feet in one minute, they prove that man has control over both his mind and body while falling at speeds from 100 to 185 miles per hour. By manipulating their arms and legs, these Navy men are able to control their rate of fall, turn in any direction, and do practically anything a modern day fighter aircraft can do except, of course, climb. In one body position for example, a jumper can travel one foot horizontally for every foot he falls vertically.

Smoke grenades attached to their boots enable the spectator to follow the free-falling jumpers as they perform such unbelievable maneuvers as four men joining up within 3 to 10 feet of each other immediately after exiting the jump aircraft at 110 miles per hour, separating at a predetermined altitude, and opening their parachutes with over a mile separation between each jumper. Another intricate maneuver includes two men exiting the aircraft together, separating for approximately 1/2 mile, passing each other within 15 to 20 feet, maintaining a relative closing speed of about 250 miles per hour. Other exhibitions include actually grasping each other during a join up, and passing a baton from jumper to jumper.

During the 1963 season alone, as an example of the "Chuting Stars" busy schedule, they completed 57 air shows throughout the country, traveling a total of 75,000 miles and performing before an estimated 4 million spectators. Their 6,000th parachute jump since the teams origin in 1961 was logged last spring at their winter training headquarters at the Naval Air Facility, El Centro, California. If the free-fall time during these jumps were totaled, the time would be 84 hours and 7 minutes and the distance traveled equaling that between New York City and Sidney, Australia.

The "Chuting Stars" show season started this year in mid-February and will extend through November. Under the supervision of the Officer in Charge, ICDA "Pete" Jarina, the team will perform at approximately 75 air shows in practically every section of the country.



Wearing gold suits, the Navy parachutists have smoke canisters strapped to their ankles which enables the spectator to follow them as they perform their aerial maneuvers. They normally jump from an altitude of 12,500 feet and freefall 10,000 feet in 60 seconds before opening their chutes. Members of the team are equipped with a stop watch and an altimeter which enables them to perform with split second accuracy and to open their chutes at the proper altitude.

The team members who judged our queen were Jim Thomann, Howard Embry and Charles Clifford. They expressed their "best wishes to Miss Bronze and the three runners-up (Miss Gold, Miss Copper, and Miss Silver) as they are fine looking girls." They sent the queen an autographed picture of the "Sunburst" (like the one shown on page 97); and the copies we show for our annual (pages 97,98,99) were sent to the staff so that we could use any or all three in this copy of the annual. They thought the pictures and history would be of interest to Corning High Students.


