




8. A NIGHTMARE TURNS TO REALITY for the Soviet people when a nuclear reactor explodes at the Chernobyl power station in April.















The Red Raider's football season didn't show much success on the field this year, but they accomplished alot in self-standards.







THE YEAR OF HAMMOND.

Another highlight for the Corning team was the Villisca series. Villisca, co-conference champs, fell to the Raiders











The school year has come to an end, as it usually does. This year was special as each year before it has been.




