Below we give the obituary of Mrs. B. F. Campbell, of Fox Ridge, S. D., who died on Decoration day at 3:45, at the home of her son Lewis of Anita. Mr. and Mrs. Campbell came to Corning April 1st, to visit their son, who in a short time removed to Anita, they going with him. The lady had for some time been ailing and after going to Anita suffered a stroke of paralysis from which she died. A short funeral service was held at the son's home, later the funeral being held at the M. E. church at Faith, S. D., where interment took place. The children all reside at Fox Ridge, a short distance from Faith, with the exception of Lewis, and desiring her body taken back there for burial, their wishes were complied with. The body was accompanied by her husband and Lewis and wife. Caroline Govig was born near Stavanger, Norway, March 25, 1855, and was aged 61 years, 2 months and 25 days. She was a daughter of Lars and Martha Govig, and when a child of four years she came to America with her parents, where they settled in Illinois, later removing to Iowa in Iowa county. Here she grew to womanhood and was married to B. F. Campbell December 25, 1873, residing there until 1891, when they came to Corning, the rest of her family residing at Strand. A singular coincidence was that Mrs. Campbell died just twenty years after her mother died, to the hour and minute. Eleven

children were born to them, six surviving with their father. They are Lewis of Anita, George, Ren, Mary, Charles and John, all residing near Fox Ridge, S. D. Mrs. Campbell leaves one brother, Lewis Govig, and one sister, Mrs. Anna Hetland, both residing near Strand. When a resident of this city Mrs. Campbell was held in high esteem by those who knew her. She was a good woman of fine, strong character and valiantly stood by her convictions for what she believed was honorable, right and just, and was one of the noblest of wives and mothers. The family left here in 1906, and went to Omaha for a couple of years, then removed to Knox county, Neb., where they lived three years, then removing to Fox Ridge, S. D. Friends in the county will regret the passing of this good woman, whose last thought was in planning for the future of her family. The reason for the delay in giving the obituary was that the relatives leaving immediately with the body left no means to obtain the facts, until their return. Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Campbell returned a short time ago and were in Corning Monday and Tuesday, and gave us the particulars.
