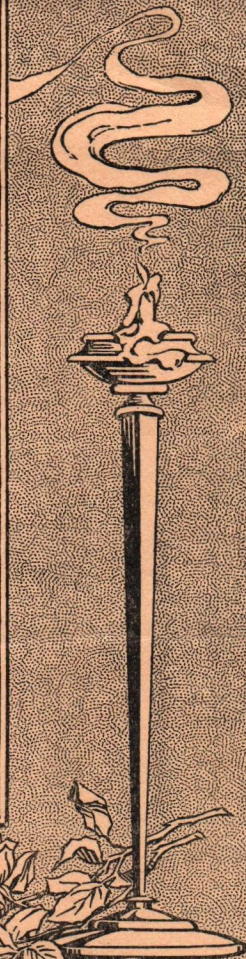

Hartford Fees, Greenfield

Hartford Fees, 88, of Greenfield, died Oct. 15, 2005, at his home. Services were 10:30 a.m. Oct. 18 at Saint John's Catholic Church in Greenfield with the Rev. Mike McLaughlin officiating. Steen Funeral Homes in Greenfield was in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Fees was born Aug. 8, 1917, in Mount Etna to W.W. and Ida (Sweet) Fees. He attended country school and graduated from Corning High School in 1934. He attended engineering school at Iowa State University. He took aviation instruction and received his pilot's license. He flew B-24 Liberators for the 449th Bomb Group, known as the "Flying Horsemen," during World War II. His group received three Distinguished Unit Citations during the spring and summer of 1944 for bombing runs over Bucharest and Ploesti, Rumania, and Schwechat, Austria. Mr. Fees flew 50 missions without having lost a single crew member and received the Distinguished Flying Cross. On Nov. 10, 1947, he married Patricia Kuhl in Corning. The couple managed the Grand Theater in Greenfield for a few years and in 1958, he went to work for Schildberg Construction Company as a pilot, retiring in 1983. Mr. Fees was an active member of Saint John's Catholic Church and the American Legion.

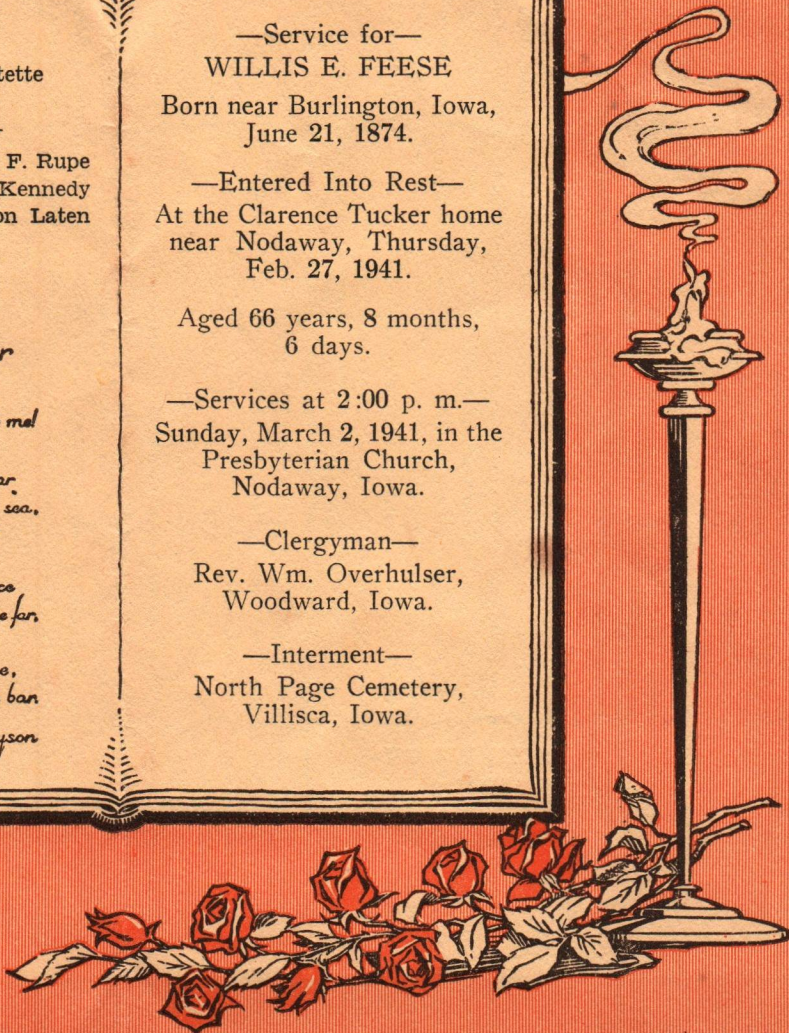

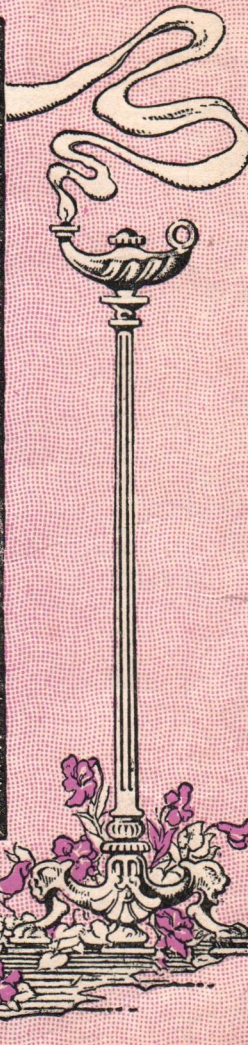

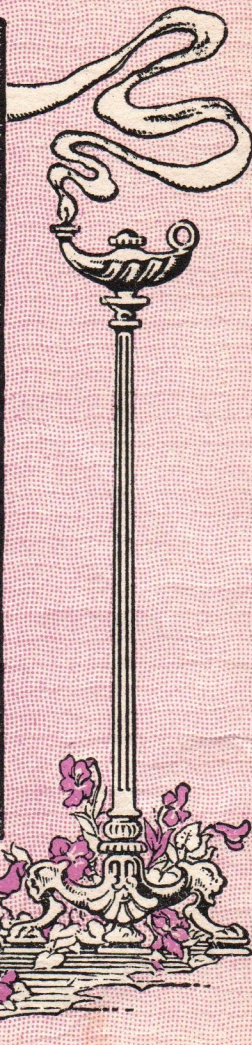
