Mrs. Jackson was born March 4, 1922, to Glen Verdet Drennan and Esther Florence Lynam Drennan and spent her first seven years on the family farm near Corning. In 1929, the family moved into town. She graduated from Corning High School in 1939, and worked in the Adams County Auditors Office for one year. She attended Northwest Missouri State where she was president of the Sigma Phi Swimming Club, treasurer of her class, secretary of the A Capella choir, drum major of the marching band, and a member of the Dance Club and the Barkatze pep squad. Mrs. Jackson was elected the first Homecoming Queen in the history of Northwest Missouri State in 1941 and Yearbook Queen in 1942. She taught business education at Hickman High School in Columbia, Mo., from 1943 to 1946 and earned her masters degree in secondary education from the University of Missouri in 1946. Mrs. Jackson moved to Des Moines in 1946 and began teaching Business classes at North High School. In 1946, she married Gareld L. Jackson (Jack). During her career in Des Moines, she became very active in business education, office education and vocational education organizations at local, state and national levels. In 1979, while still teaching office education at North, Mrs. Jackson was appointed supervisor of business education for the Des Moines Public School, the first woman to hold that position. She retired in 1987. Mrs. Jackson was a member of Delta Kappa Gamma and past president of the Northwest Missouri State University Alumni Association. She attended Plymouth Congregational United Church of Christ and was involved in a private Bible study group in West Des Moines.

Survivors include sister and brother-in-law Janet and Darwin Marlatt of Tacoma, Wash.; sister-in-law Mae Jackson of Eldora; son Jerry L. Jackson of Studio City, Calif.; daughter and son-in-law Cindy and Steve Rasmussen of Columbus, Ohio; first cousins Donald and Paul Lynam; and five grandsons.

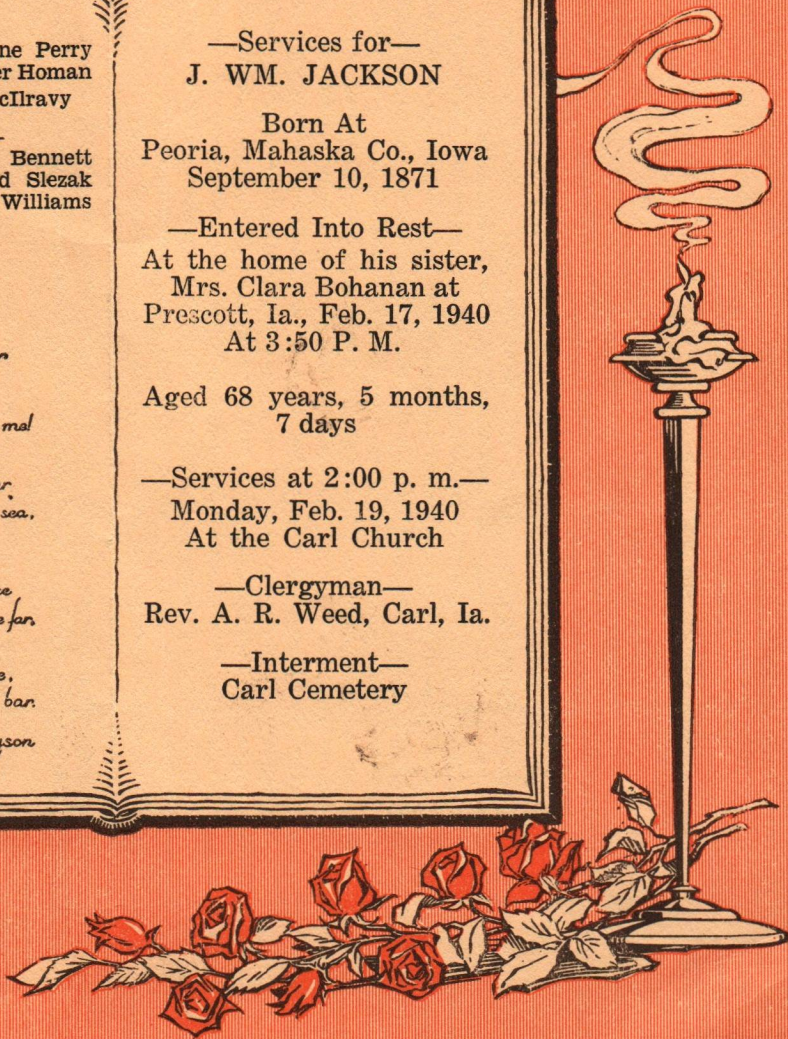

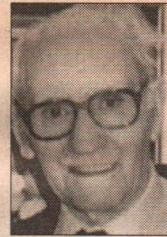

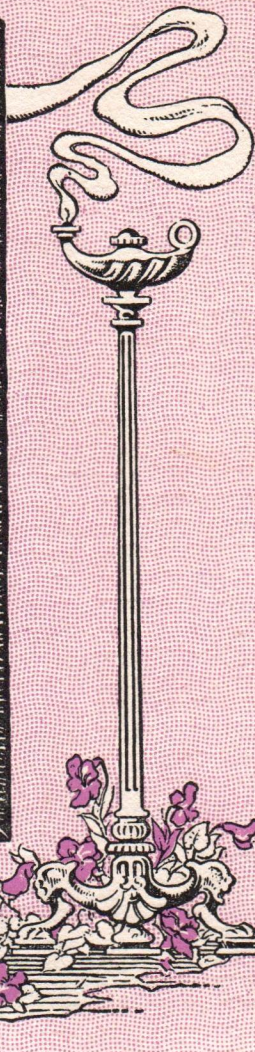
