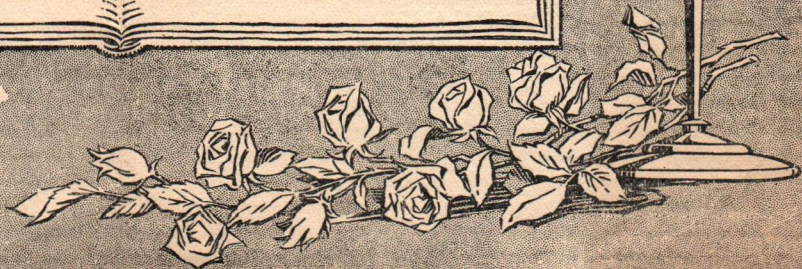

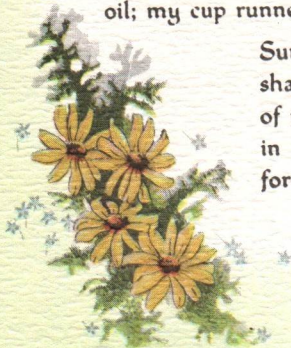

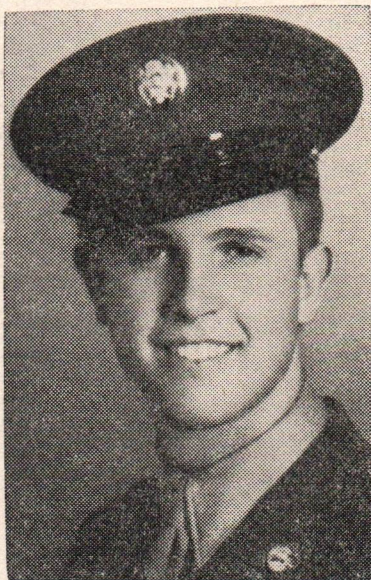

I believe true happiness comes from watching your crops ripen in the field, your children grow tall in the sun, your whole family feel the pride that springs from their shared experience.

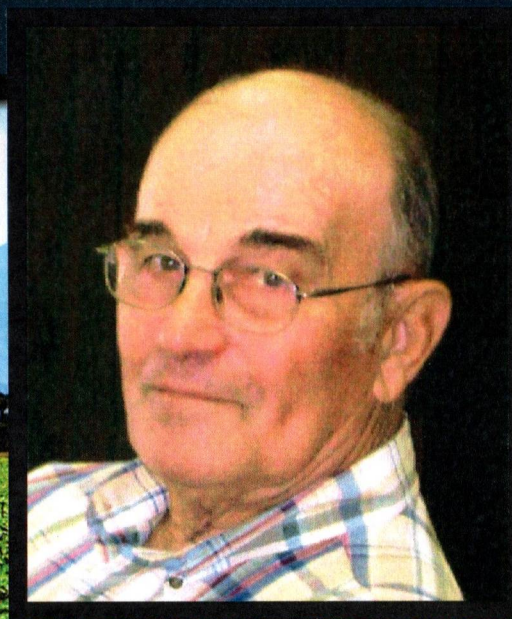
I believe that by my toil I am giving more to the world than I am taking from it, an honor that does not come to all men.

I believe in farming because it makes all this possible.

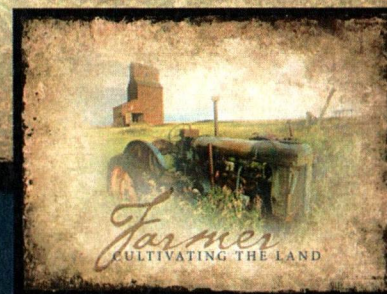

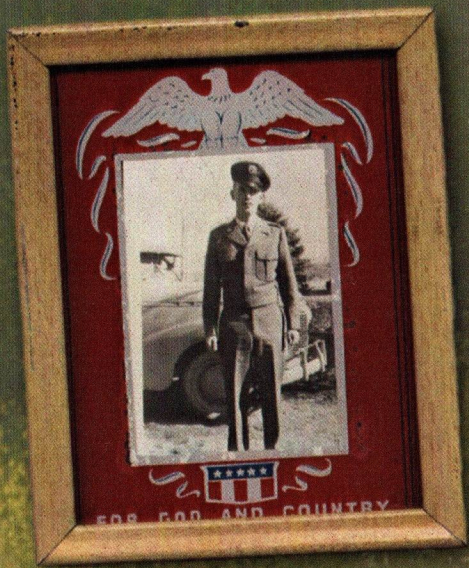

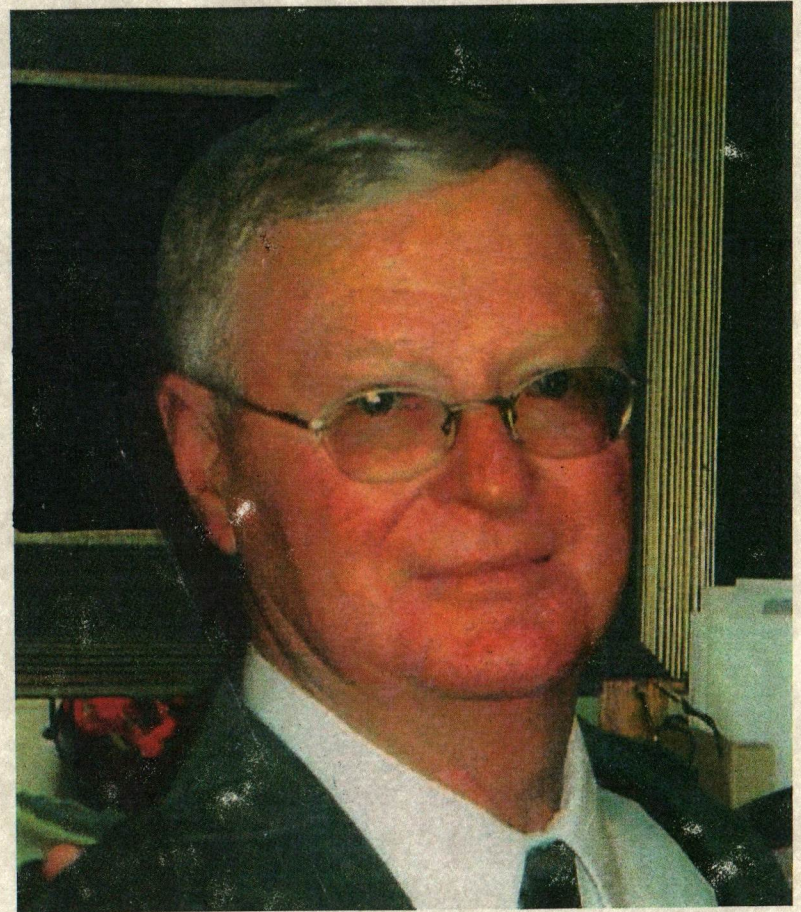
Life is like a round of golf
